


Knowing What's Normal: Vital Signs

Normal



Vital Signs

BAR: Bright, Alert, Responsive

E/D/U/D: Eating, Drinking, Urinating, Defecating Normally

Temperature: 99-101° F

Pulse: 25-40 beats/minute

Respiration: 8-24 breaths/minute

Gum Color: Pink and moist

Capillary Refill Time: 1-2 seconds



Gut Sounds: occasional long rumbles and short gurgles

Secretions (Nasal/Eye): Minimal, clear and watery
